In August Maaoridom celebrated the kingitanga movement with the annual koroneihana and celebration but soon after that Maaoridom had the devastating news that kiingi Tuhetia Potatau tewherowhero te tuawhitu had passed away. The tangi was a nation wide focus event as Maaoridon grieved for this loss but at the same time many waited in anticipation as to who would be his successor. Elation hit the mourners when, Tuheitia's daughter, Nga wai hono i te poo was announced as his successor. It was a great loss for all New Zealanders with the King passing and the beginning of a new era with the new Maaori queen. Tuhetia advocated Kotahitanga- unity across the nation especially with the raruraru and heated debate and discussions about the Tiriti o Waitangi the founding document of our nation. He believed through korero, robust discussion debate, and working together was the only way forward. He knew that the turbulent times ahead needed someone who could unite everyone and I believe Ngawai hono i te poo was the right person to do this. Rest in peace Tuheitia Moe ma ra!

Kotahitanga is about getting people together and as a school we did this by celebrating the Golden Jubilee – 50 years young. In April this year. . .

... ex-students, teachers and whaanau gathered and reminisced about the old days at Tuakau College. In 1974 Hiwi Tauroa opened the College and set the founding values, principles and direction. It reflected what the school community was about at the time and as we have grown we have continued to reflect and 'walk the talk' with these founding principles. It was a great weekend and a huge thank you to the school community for their support of the reunion. A toanga from the reunion were two pou at the Elizabeth St entrance. 'Tuaahua' and 'Hinekura' stand tall and proud here. These two figures represent the students past and present and tell the story of getting students to stand tall with their identity and mana and to shine in whatever they do. They represent a strong foundation for our children and our community.

These days it has become more challenging to accommodate the diverse student body, diverse community views, the changing curriculum and assessment and the continuous social media hits that schools, like ours get. Even though it is hard I can assure the school community that we are coping and that the school is always reviewing what we are doing and ensuring every student can do the very best they can. The principles that Hiwi Tauroa instilled in the school remain cemented in the College culture-these values are: Whanaungatanga (family), Kotahitanga (unity), Manaakitanga (caring), Kaitiakitanga (protection), stewardship and "Pai rawa atu I nga mea katoa – the very best in all things" (excellence).

Tuakau College has been taken to task with slanted information through posts on unmoderated social media sites. We have used the strengths of our taonga and the cultural principles to deal with such issues. These posts are a distraction from the real work we do and that is educating your students. I have no issue with having frank discussions with parents and caregivers about the issues, face to face. But when the issue is thrown at the media and or on social networks before giving us the opportunity to discuss, review and to take action this is totally unacceptable. This school is not perfect, the staff are human and we make mistakes but I can assure the school community we want to continue to work with you to ensure we review, and continually improve practice so the students get the very best they can. In saying this we are thankful to the majority of parents and caregivers in our school community that continue to support, collaborate and assist us with kotahitanga and manaakitanga. We are you and you are us. Because we cannot do this by ourselves, there are a few things we need to focus on for next year:

- · Lateness to school needs to improve. Please ensure your child gets to school on time. Next year school starts at 9:00am.
- Your student's attendance has to be at 90%. The government wants 80% of all students to attend school at a rate of 90%. They are calling this regular attendance. There is a key correlation that if your student does not attend at this level that their education is significantly impacted. At present Tuakau College has a regular attendance rate of 49%. We have until 2030 to move from 49% to 90% and to do this we need all parents/caregivers to ensure their children are at school, holidays are taken at the correct time and that all absences are genuine. Our Attendance strategy will be published early next year.
- Please, as parents/caregivers, check your child is following the uniform code before they arrive at school so we do not have issues with student's wearing non-regulation uniform items. If they do it creates issues at our end, battling teenagers who believe the school rules apply to everyone else except themselves.
- Please support the school when non-compliance occurs. Often we get 'kick back' from parents about issues when students do not follow the school rules. It seems to be a sign of the times. After discussions with you we expect support from you as parents/caregivers. If we are wrong we will admit it and fix it but the school rules are the school rules set by our Board.
- Please be proactive around the learning your students are doing. Do you monitor their homework, their devices and do you assist them? It is imperative because the work completed at home supports the student when they are at school and the goals they want to achieve.
- Keep in touch with your student's teachers as often as possible. Meet with them face -to-face, even outside the parent teacher interview times, and discuss your child's pathway to success in that subject.
- Are you still doing what is required to keep your child safe on social media platforms, and devices?
- Finally, the Board develops school policies like uniform. The school staff implement these policies and make them work. If the community have issues with any policy then please communicate that to the Board and they will consider changes.

Once again thank you for your ongoing support. Working together is what we are asking! He waka eke noa – We are all in this together.

NCEA has developed and become more challenging for many of our students. Literacy and Numeracy is the challenge. This government is fast-tracking major infrastructure projects but they are also fast-tracking changes in education. As teachers we agree that a change is needed but the pace at which these changes are occurring has impacted timetables, professional development and staff wellbeing. Like any major change, the only way this is going to work is for the staff to make it happen. It does not happen at the political or Ministry level, but it happens on the ground in our classrooms. The pressure comes on to make it work and to ensure our students are achieving under the new requirements. Thank you to all the staff for making this happen. Your work does not go un-noticed. As a school we have been regularly very successful with NCEA and we should all be proud of this. Our results last year saw:

- 83% of Level 1 students passed NCEA Level 1
- 92% at Level 2 and 65% at NCEA Level 3.

These were the best in the Franklin area and we should all celebrate the success of our students because it puts them in good stead for their future. By focusing on achievement it does not mean we have taken our 'eye off the ball' with other issues. I can assure the school community we are working very hard in other areas as well. Teaching is a great profession and being able to work alongside students and their. . .

... families, to watch students grow, achieve and assist them on a pathway to success is gratifying and this is why we do this job. Thank you to the Board, the community and the Senior Leadership Team for their continued support of the staff as they continue to work hard. I want to thank the teachers, Teaching Assistants, relief teachers, support staff, Admin staff and the cleaning and grounds staff - all who have a role to play in making our school function and to make it the very best in all things. Ngaa mihi nui nga hoa ma!

In 2024 we have had staff leave us and staff join us. It has been very dynamic as we build capacity as a larger school. We have been very lucky to be able to find staff to replace the ones leaving. Next year we will also have more changes:

- Mrs Hucker is retiring she has been at Tuakau College for 35 years. What an achievement for her and for the College. She has seen many changes in this time like three new 'green' Principals and the school growing from 350 to over 1000 students. If only the walls could talk! I bet there are many stories the walls could tell us like the antics in Mrs Hucker's classroom, the trips she took, the sports she managed and the ski trips she organized with Mrs Simpson. Mrs Hucker; thank you for the 35 years of dedicated work, the influences you have had on students over this time and the legacy you are going to leave behind. You are going to be missed by all, and as a school community we wish you the best in your retirement.
- Mr Chidambaram we wish you all the best in your retirement. He has been teaching here for 20 years. Mr Chidambaram was one of the first teachers I appointed as a new Principal back in 2004. Enjoy travelling and being a grandparent!
- Mrs Van Kan is retiring. Teaching Assistants are key in supporting students and staff in the classroom and Mrs Van Kan has been doing this for the past 19 years. She supported the Food Technology area for many years as well. Nga mihi nui Mrs Van Kan and all the best in your retirement.
- Mrs Burton is leaving and going to teach at St Ignatius. Thank you for the 8 years of service and for setting up our Outdoor Education programme.
- We also farewell Mrs Blackwood, Mr and Mrs van Rensburg, Mrs Yeo, Miss Muir, Mrs Dunchie-Coley, Miss Pritchard and Mr McEwing.
























The pou were named on the morning of Monday 22 April, 2024 (morning of the blessing/unveiling). Their names are 'Tuaahua' and 'Hinekura.' Each person can make their own interpretations of 'Tuaahua' but basically it means to stand with your own and stand in your own – with your identity and your mana and to help tautoko everyone else's. 'Tuaahua' means to almost stand and shine. 'Hinekura' has more of an embracing feel to it. The carver combined a lot of the korero from Maaoritanga and our culture and acknowledged certain aspects that are sort of vital to the waharoa to be the gateway inviting people in and protecting and looking after people and encouraging them, etc.

For each person that has been through Tuakau College, what is consistent is that each person has found their passion of some sort, through struggles and triumph. They have all reached their own versions of success. That's what our taonga's (the pou) are about - to help everyone find their own successes. Not just for students but for everyone.

As we acknowledge the past with the unveiling of the plaque, we also acknowledge the 50 years to come with the unveiling of the pou. 




TOUGH GUY/GAL 2024


